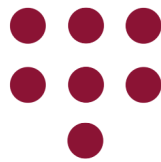

— STAFF FAVES —

Not sure what to drink? Defer to those who know this list the best! These are the bottles that the staff have fallen for hard. This section will change frequently, so be sure to check back often!

Chardonnay Rhys, Santa Cruz Mountains, California 2019 \$95

As someone who is typically not a big Chardonnay drinker, this bottle is a delightful surprise, with a delicious toastiness and a hint of vanilla coupled with more subtle tropical fruit notes. It's a wonderful, round, winter white. - **Lexis**

Crozes-Hermitage Equis, 'Domaine des Lises,' Northern Rhône, France 2020 \$75

The Crozes-Hermitage is my favorite red on the bottle list. With its dry finish and somewhat tannic and full-bodied taste, this Syrah from the Rhône has notes of blackberry and blueberry that pair perfectly with our lamb skewers and yogurt-mint sauce. - **Julian**

Falanghina San Francesco, 'Per Eva,' Costa d'Amalfi, Italy 2020 \$82

Falanghina has everything I could want in a white wine as we head into the colder months. With notes of white flower, almond, peach, and a slight mineral quality, each sip has so much flavor to explore. I consider it the perfect winter white for those of us who are daydreaming about a summer on the Amalfi Coast as we brave the chilly winter in NYC. - **Makenna**

For those who prefer a riper style from the new world, with aromas of lime, yellow pear, and melon rind.

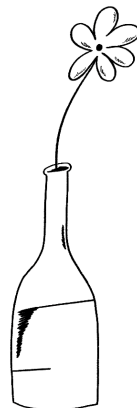
Semillón Escandalo, Colchagua Valley, Chile **2022** **\$56**

— AROMA THERAPY —

Some wines have pronounced aromas of flowers such as honeysuckle or fruits like lychee. We love that these wines are distinctive and evocative, with intense aromas bursting out of the glass. Pro tip: drink them with hard to match dishes such as salads or foods with a slight kick!

CASE STUDY: CHARDONNAY

Are you an A.B.C (anything but Chardonnay) drinker? Challenge your opinions and give Chardonnay another chance - you might just walk away with a different impression by the end of the bottle!

As one of the most versatile and widely planted varietals in the world, Chardonnay can range from lean and bright to rich and creamy and everything in between, all depending on where it is grown and the decisions of the winemaker.

Chardonnay hails from the cool climate region of Burgundy in France, and produces some of the most sought after wines in the world. The white wines of Burgundy show the full range of Chardonnay, from younger, leaner versions to opulent, age-worthy oaked styles. Across the Atlantic, California Chardonnay often gets a bad rap for being overly oaked and buttery, but with a new wave movement shaking things up over the last decade, it is impossible to paint Chardonnay with one buttery brush. Now you will find leaner expressions with less oak treatment and malolactic fermentation (which gives wines that distinctive buttery taste and texture) allowing the wines to lead with their natural ripe, tropical fruit flavors.

— OFF-DRY TO SWEET —

The key to any great wine is balance. For a sweet wine to not taste cloying and syrupy it needs to have a sufficient acidity to balance out the residual sugar. When we are looking for sweet wines for the list, this sense of balance is what we are seeking. These are some examples of wines that we find to be gracefully sweet. Give them a try alongside a cheese slate for a match made in heaven.

— SAKE —

Sake is a traditional Japanese rice wine made by fermenting specific strains of rice with *kōji*, yeast, and water. Part of the grading system for sake is based on “polish ratio,” or how much of the rice grain is removed before fermentation. Sake can encompass a range of styles, from delicate and floral, to earthy and lactic, to sweet and fruity. Such diverse options make for plentiful exciting food pairings!

ORANGE FAQs

Is orange wine a new thing?

While orange wines have gained a great deal in popularity in recent years, this style of wine is as ancient as winemaking itself, dating back almost 6000 years from the area where Georgia (the country) is now.

Is orange wine made from oranges?

Nope! Orange wine is made by leaving the skins of white grapes in contact with the fermenting juice (normally the skins are immediately removed in the production of white wine).

What does orange wine taste like?

As a result of the skin contact, deeper, more concentrated flavors can develop in these wines. They tend to be a more bold and savory version of a wine from the very same grape, with added tannin and texture.

— ROSÉ —

We seek out rosés that are dry and delicious, whether they are uncomplicated poolside sippers or those with deep color and more complex, robust flavors. Try a familiar favorite like those from France, or branch out to a lesser known region like Hungary.

— CRUNCHY REDS —

You know that burst of mouthwatering, tangy fruit flavor when you bite into a fresh berry? That is exactly what we mean when we call these wines “crunchy.” Typically light in body and low in tannin, these reds have bright acidity and crisp fruit flavors.

PINOT NOIR AROUND THE WORLD

Pinot Noir is hands down the most ordered red here at Ardesia. Why is it so beloved? It is famous for its delicate, ethereal red fruit flavors and its ability to express a sense of place, sometimes down to a very specific row of vines within a vineyard. While its home is the Burgundy region of France, and despite it being considered one of the most fickle and hard to grow grapes, winemakers from all over the world successfully grow expressions of their own terroir.

Garden wines. We find that the fruity characteristics in these reds take a back seat, while the distinctive herbal notes from green, leafy aromas to planter-box herbs like rosemary, thyme and oregano, are more prominent.

Generally medium bodied with concentrated fruit flavors, these are great options for groups that have a wide range of tastes. The fruity qualities of these wines can vary from light red fruits like cherry and raspberry to darker ones like blueberry and blackcurrant.

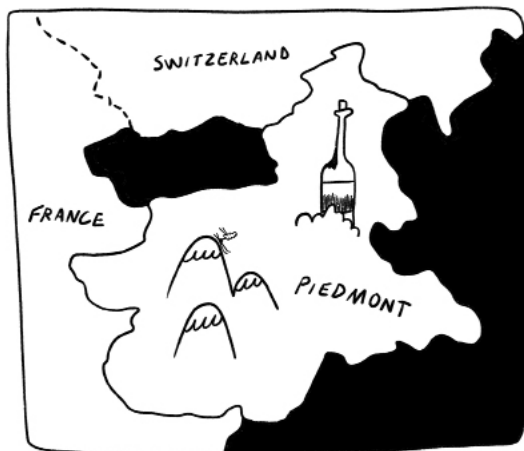

* Let's talk about Merlot - it sure does get a bad rap. This is partially because the movie *Sideways* (2004) mocked the grape as part of its story line, and had such an impact that sales of Merlot dropped (while Pinot Noir skyrocketed). Some producers across California even tore up their Merlot vines. We are here to remind you that Merlot is in fact a grape that makes delicious wines! Round, soft, and easy to drink with bright red fruit. Not to mention, it's one of the main grapes in some of the most famous blends from Bordeaux.

— DECODE PIEDMONT —

The region of Piedmont (or Piemonte in Italian [pyeh-MON-tay]) is one of the most famous, not only in Italy, but also around the world. It is best known for its reds with incredible aging potential, especially those from Barolo and Barbaresco where wines are made from the beautiful Nebbiolo grape. Situated in the northwest corner of Italy, the region is surrounded on three sides by mountains—the Alps in the north and west and the Apennines in the south. The ancient phrase “a pie de monte” literally means at the “foot of the mountains.”

Looking for a red that packs a punch? These wines check all the boxes: bold in flavor, richness, and structure. The highest ends of the spectrum. They often hail from warmer regions which produce grapes with high levels of sugar that then convert to high levels of alcohol during fermentation (wine 101!). The result is a wine with a full body, intensity, and muscle. Bonus: pair these with fatty foods - their robust tannins allow them to stand up to the richness of the dish.

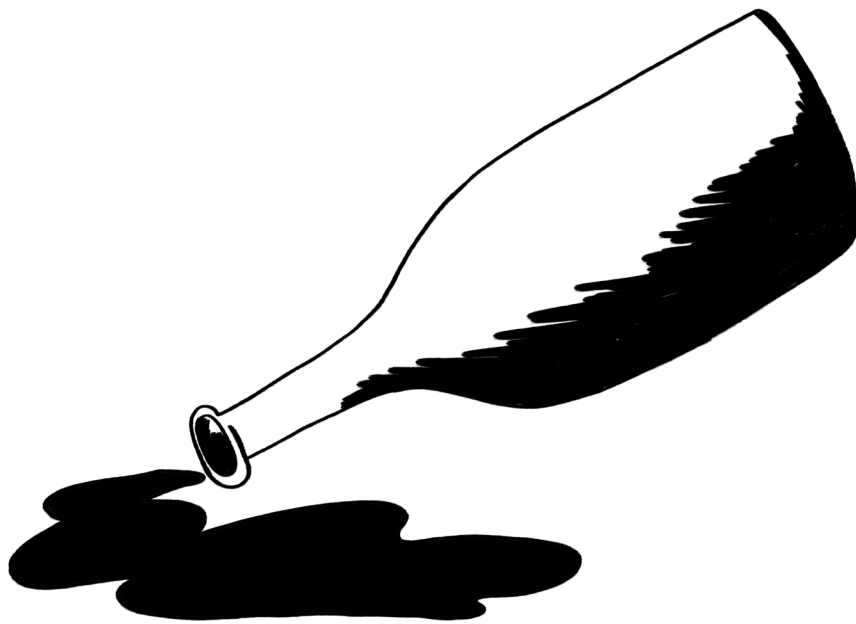
